**\*Native American dancing will be on the grounds around Scout Village at the Handicraft Area with some drumming and other activities in the Gym. Sessions will be announced on location. Regalia and other artifacts will also be on display. Join us for the instructional evening Pow Wow in the Gym Facility Building. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend!**

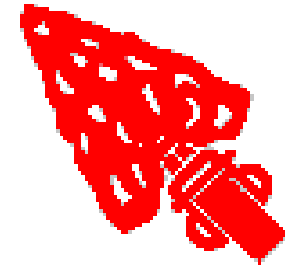

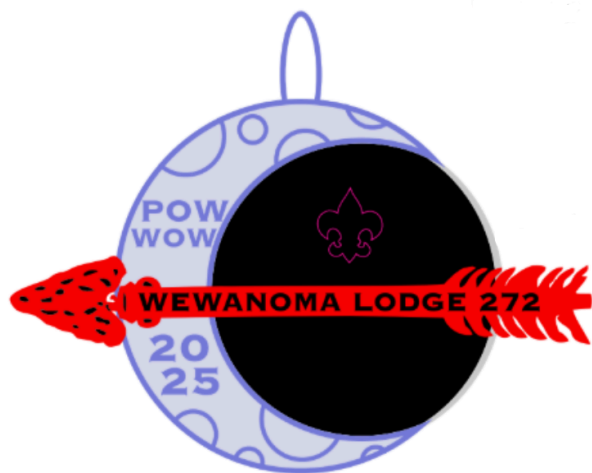

**Where will the activities take place?**

- The Cub Scout/Webelos Village is in the area **around** the New Dining Hall, the Armadillo Campsite, grounds around the OA Lodge, and Gym for all Cub Scouts, Webelos, Tagalongs, and others ages 5-9 (Kinder-5th grade.)
- The Dining Hall area and Cub/Webelo Village Activities will be open to ALL SCOUTS.

- The Scout Village is in the Handicraft/Scoutcraft Area and is open to Scouts BSA and others (6th Grade and older). Many merit badge activities will take place here. This village is open for anyone to walk through and some activities that are age appropriate can be enjoyed by all participants.

Scout Village Activities include but are not limited to Bow Drills, Traps, Teepee Fires, Shelter Construction, Drumming and Singing, Storytelling, Spoon Burning, Displays and Vendors.

- Bows and Arrows will be located at the Archery Range. These activities are open for ages 5+. BB's will be located at the Rifle Range from 9-11:45am.

**• \*Black Powder/Muzzle Loading (1 shot for \$1.00, pay on site). Rifle 22's (1-4pm only) for Scout Aged Participants.\***

**• \*Tomahawk & Shotgun Shooting is offered for Scouts. Eligibility is at the discretion of the instructor. Located by the Rifle & Shotgun Ranges.\***

**\* Must have Range and Target Activity Permission Slips\***

**\*Rifle/Shotgun: 5 Shots free for Youth, \$5.00 for 5 additional Shots, limit 10 total shots per Youth & 5 for total for Adults. Purchase tickets at Trading Post.\***

### **Other Information**

- Permission slip is required for participation in Range and Target Activities.
- Some skills taught in the Scout Village may require the use of a pocketknife. Scouts are required to have their Totin' Chip and Webelos must have their Whittlin' Chip.
- **To receive full or partial Indian Lore Merit Badge credit, Scouts must check in at the STEM Building. Not checking in/turning in the green Requirement Sheet means no credit. Turn in Green Req. Sheets by 9 PM after Pow Wow in the Gym. Special Patch Forms due at the same time.** IL Merit Badge is only for Scouts in a Scouting Unit. MB Cards will be returned to Adult Leaders at Check Out on Sunday.
- Youth and Adult restrooms are in the Gym Building and at the back of the Dining Hall. Trail Latrines are open to all too. **LOCK DOORS when in use!**
